President's Message for July 2020





Tackle Box - July 2020

July... We have just passed the Summer Solstice, the longest day of the year, and are rapidly headed toward winter... We do have a few months of summer left and the afternoon storms continue to remind us that we are in the rainy season.

Rain not only impacts our daily fishing trips but holds a bigger concern when we look at the rainfall in areas north of Lake Okeechobee. This year we are seeing rainfall in the Kissimmee Basin, just north of Lake "O",

which is spreading nutrients into the lake. A large blue-green algae bloom is already detectable covering almost one half of the lake. Wink News reported that the NOAA Satellite images indicated a large area of Cyanobacteria within the bloom. Currently, the lake level is low enough to preclude major discharges into the Caloosahatchee River. As we recall from 2018, large lake releases containing Cyanobacteria became the nutrient source for the massive Red Tide that year. We are still dealing with the aftereffects of that condition.

During June, our club held a backwater fishing event, the "Hooky-Snooky", and 26 anglers on 14 boats participated in the event and dealt with weather concerns. Some nice-sized snook were recorded. Be sure to check-out the event report in this edition.

Testing the waters, so to speak, we also held our first social event since early March; the "Social Distancing Picnic". Adhering to both the CDC and Governor DeSantis' guidelines, we held the picnic at Sarazen Park with a limit of 50 attendees.

We kick off the premier event of the season with the annual "Triple Crown Tournament" on July 1st. Always an exciting event, this four-month long tournament challenges our anglers to catch Tarpon, Snook, and Redfish. Looking at the size of the Snook caught in the Hooky-Snooky event, there are some big snook just waiting to be caught. Over 30 anglers are already registered, and more are sure to sign-up. Read more about the tournament in this edition.

July will also see the return of our annual "Shark Tournament", and although this year's event will be modified to account for the social restrictions due to Covid-19, we think it will be a fun event. More details are contained in the article in this edition.

Not forgetting our Offshore Anglers, the club will embark on a two-month "Offshore Slam" event starting August 1st. The inaugural event will require our offshore anglers to catch four species of fish: Grouper, Snapper, Cobia and Permit. Like the Triple Crown Tournament, the anglers will need to catch all 4 species and can continue to upgrade their registered catch during the two months. See the flyer for more details.

As a reminder, Rose Auditorium remains closed and therefore our July, August and September meetings have been cancelled. Stay safe and healthy.

Offshore Update - July 2020

First, what's happening offshore – It is ARS season – American Red Snapper. This is the time we all wait for. This year the powers to be have given us more time to fish - ARS season for recreational anglers is June 11 through July 25 and "for hire" vessels is June 1 through Aug 1. Several captains have already been reporting catches and limits on nice fish. Most of the fish have been coming from 175-200' of water, but several folks have gotten them as shallow as 145'. The snapper spawn is over, the red grouper are in the summer homes (and not very hungry as of this writing), permit and cobia are on the move but still around. Get out there and have some fun...and be safe.

We sent out an event flyer for a new tournament...The Offshore Slam (the flyer is attached to this newsletter as well). Anglers must catch one of each species (snapper – lane, mangrove or yellowtail; grouper – red, gag or black; cobia; permit) to complete the Offshore Slam and qualify for prizes. Fishing is open from Aug 1 through Sept 30. You must be entered by Aug 1 to participate...Sign up today!

Rules:

- All anglers must be an active MSC Member.
- MSC "No Guide Rule" applies No fishing with, or on, a guide's boat.
- MSC "Offshore Boundaries" apply South to Lat N 25.10.0, North to Lat N 26.05.5120', must fish within these boundaries and at a depth of 120' or less.
- "Two Line Rule" applies No more than two rods per angler.
- All fish entered must be caught by the angler entering the fish without assistance from any other angler.
- 6. Each fish entered must be photographed individually on a vertical edge tournament ruler, mouth closed and tight against the vertical edge of the ruler (not following the measurement rules may result in a reduction in size if the measurement is not clearly evident). All photos must be emailed to Jim Scarpa at the email address above by the end of the day caught.
- Entry fee must be received by Jim Scarpa before August 1, 2020 or the angler cannot participate in the tournament.

June Kayak Fishing Event at the Shell Island/Rookery Bay by Howard Laskau

MSC kayak group held its monthly outing on Friday, June 26th. Shell Island was the launch point, and from there the group had access to a lot of great fishing areas in and around Rookery Bay. Although it was warm, there was a lot of cloud cover, so conditions on the water were quite nice.

Redfish, snook and snapper seemed to be the "fish of the day". Mike Larsen had a four-foot Tarpon on his line for a while and after launching himself into the air a few times, the Tarpon finally broke free. Dave Dodd landed a nice size flounder as well. Dave also caught a 23 1/2" snook, and that put him on the Kayak group leaderboard for 2020. Howard Laskau caught a 23" snook that almost made it!

The next Kayak Group outing is scheduled for July 7th. We will be exploring the popular and exciting upper East River. In the past, this area has proven to be very productive for snook and redfish. If you like nature, mangrove tunnels and wildlife this is a trip for you! To find out more about the MSC Kayak Group please visit the MSC website. Well you caught a shark Now what

You said you wanted to catch a shark and have it for dinner. Well you went and caught one, now what. They are great eating, but the real trick to a shark dinner starts with what you do right after you catch them out on the water. I strongly suggest that know the types you can legally harvest and that you only keep them if they are less than 5 feet. Bringing a 5 ft or greater Shark in to your boat green is asking for big time trouble. I normally like the Blacktip and the Atlantic Sharp Nose at 4 feet and under. They are very aggressive and since they have cartilage instead of bone, they can whip around and almost bite their tail. To better understand me, keep in mind I am fishing out of a 22 foot Pathfinder. I think my recommendations would work as well if you were fishing from a 30 foot Pursuit.

As soon as you get the shark close enough to the boat to identify you have a important decision to make. If he is a keeper(both size and species) then I suggest you let him fight till he is exhausted. This is the point you might want to put on a pair of fishing gloves, Shark skin is not slippery but rather like course sandpaper. They can take the skin right off your hands if they start to thrash.

I suggest you bring a short (6ft) piece of rope and tie a noose in one end. Take the prepared rope and slip the noose over his tail while he is alongside your boat and snug it up. A Shark's tail does not fold and your noose will not come loose if you keep it tight. Pull it up tight and tie him off to a cleat with fish's head in the water. His demise will come a little quicker if his gills are just above the water line. Now is the time to cut your fishing line near the Sharks mouth (Not to close, he still can bite). You can get your hook back latter. Hay, the hook only cost less than a dollar and you're your hand is priceless. Much we do next will be while he is still over the side and not snapping at our heals. They stay dangerous for an exceptionally long time.

Now is a good time to take a rest and get out your longest sharp knife. You need to bleed out a shark to keep the meat pure and tasting good. Most

sharks rid themselves of urea by their blood taking it to their gills and it being expelled there. So, they need to be completely drained of blood as early as you can. With their head still in the water, take the knife and thrust it in behind their gill plates and cut through their gills on both sides. Because their heart is still pumping this will completely drain them of blood/urea. It can take a while drain them, so this would be a good time to have a cup of coffee and relax.

The next step is the gutting of the fish to remove all the internal organs. This will also be done while the shark is hanging over the side. I suggest you insert the knife at the rear and cutting the belly from the inside out down to the gills. Shark skin is very tough and abrasive and if you cut from the outside in you will have a hard time, for some reason from the inside to the outside works much better.

Dump the innards (overboard) like you would in any other fish and continue to flush in the sea water. Between the blood and the offal, you will be just adding to your chum slick. I promise, you do not want any of that blood or innards working its way into your bilge. I once knew a old time club member that got the blood into his bilge and he thought he was going to have to sell his boat.

OK, it is now time to bring your catch into your boat. Still be careful, their ability to thrash and bite can last longer than you think. This is where that under 5 Feet comes into play. The fish need to be iced down at once, but according to the LAW they must be kept whole (in one piece from nose to tail). You can't cut of the tail or any of the fins. They demand it whole. Luckily, their lack of bones can allow them to be bent to fit in a large cooler. If they do not fit, you can pack them in Ice in some plastic bags as you head home. Remember to pack their gut cavity with ice as well. It is time to head back to your dock.

Once at your home cleaning station you will need the following Item, Lots of Ice, a big bowl, a sharp filet Knife and a saw bladed (serrated) kitchen knife. Now is the time to get your hook back. You can cut the fish into filets or steaks; it will cook great either way. Though folks will often soak the Shark in Milk over night before cooking to remove any last urea taste, I have found it not necessary if the fish has been bled as I described. (Particularly Blacktip and Atlantic Sharp Nose Sharks.)

When Fileting, remember to cut through the Shark skin from the inside out. They filet just like any other lager fish, except there are no small rib bones to deal with. Shark is easy to steak, since the serrated knife will cut through the cartilage easily. After the steaks are grilled, the skin just peals off. Keep everything as cold as you can through the cleaning process.

Like all fish, shark cooks quite quickly. If grilling, you will need to coat with a little oil and seasoning to keep it from sticking and drying out. Truly, very little seasoning is needed. It is a very mild fish, which cooks up white with a little more Texture "bite" than Grouper or Redfish. A lot of folks find they like texture of shark over the softer flaky kind of fish.

Thanks for reading and giving Shark a try, Grouper and Redfish, both strongly recommend it.
