Offshore Update – July 2021

What's Happening Offshore...

American Red Snapper Season is open for recreational anglers thru July 28, 2021. The bite has been very good in 150'+. The best bite occurs when there is decent current flow, many captains have been reporting quick limits on squid, cut bait and pinfish. The Red Grouper are being caught in deeper water and there have been a few reports of keepers in as close as 40' recently, expect them to begin to move shallower as the water gets warmer. The Snapper are out there on the wrecks and ledges and there have been some very nice mangroves caught recently (don't forget to bring your barracuda repellant!). Cobia and permit are around on the nearshore and offshore reefs and towers, good numbers of permit continue to be reported. The best fishing will usually occur on the better tide days and windows – use your solunar activity tables. Focus on catching your trophy fish for the "MSC Offshore Slam, proudly sponsored by Rose Marina". Get out there and have some fun...and be safe.

Awards Party: There will be an awards party at Rose Marina in January 2022 (date / time TBA)

Rules:

- 1. All anglers must be an active MSC Member.
- 2. MSC "No Guide Rule" applies No fishing with, or on, a guide's boat.
- 3. MSC "Offshore Boundaries" apply South to Lat N 25.10.0, North to Lat N 26.05.5120', must fish within these boundaries and at a depth of 120' or less.
- 4. "Two Line Rule" applies No more than two rods per angler.
- 5. All fish entered must be caught by the angler entering the fish without assistance from any other angler.
- 6. Each fish entered must be photographed individually on a vertical edge tournament ruler, mouth closed and tight against the vertical edge of the ruler (not following the measurement rules may result in a reduction in size if the measurement is not clearly evident). All entry photos must be emailed to Jim Scarpa at the email address above within 24 hours of being caught, please include the name of the boat captain as well.
- 7. Sign-up Sheet and Entry Fee must be received by Jim Scarpa by June 30, 2021 or the angler cannot participate in the tournament. While tournament entry is allowed after fishing begins, no fish may be entered in the tournament that is caught prior to the angler submitting their Sign-up Sheet and Entry Fee.

Well, you caught a Shark Now what

You said you wanted to catch a Shark and have it for dinner. You have heard how good to eat they are. Well, you went and caught one, now what. They are great eating, but the real trick to a Shark dinner starts with what you do right after you catch them out on the water. If you wait till you get back to your dock you might be disappointed.

I strongly suggest that know the types you can legally harvest and that you only keep them if they are <u>less</u> than 5 feet. Bringing a 5 ft or greater Shark into your boat is asking for big time trouble. I normally like the Blacktip and the Atlantic Sharp Nose at 4 feet and under. All Sharks are extremely aggressive and since they have cartilage instead of bone, they can whip around and almost bite their tail. I think my recommendations would work as well if you were fishing from a 30-foot Pursuit or a 22 ft Bay boat. I have done this quite a few times off my Pathfinder in Gullivan Bay.

As soon as you get the Shark close enough to the boat to identify, you have an important decision to make. If he is a keeper (both in size and species) then I suggest you let him fight till he is exhausted. If not, cut him loose and let him keep the hook. Remember, Black Tip, Atlantic Sharp Nose or Bonnethead have no size limit whereas many of the

others need to be at least 54 inches or greater. Many types cannot be kept at all. OK, you decided to go for it. This is the point you might want to put on a pair of fishing gloves, Shark skin is not slippery but rather like course sandpaper. They can take the skin right off your hands if they start to thrash. But do not bring them into the boat at this point.

I suggest you bring a short (6ft) piece of rope and tie a noose in one end. Take the prepared rope and slip the noose over his tail while he is alongside your boat and snug it up. A Shark's tail does not fold and your noose will not come loose if you keep it tight. Pull it up tight and tie the tail off to a cleat with fish's head in the water. His demise will come a little quicker if his gills are just above the water line. Now is the time to cut your fishing line near the Sharks mouth (Not to close, he still will bite). You can get your hook back latter. Hey, the hook cost less than a dollar and your hand is priceless. Almost all of what we do next will be while he is still over the side with his nose in the water and not snapping at our heals in the boat. They stay dangerous for an exceptionally long time.

Then get out your longest sharp knife. You need to bleed out a Shark to keep the meat pure and tasting good. Most Sharks rid themselves of urea by their blood taking it to their gills and it being expelled there. So, they need to be completely drained of blood as early as you can. With their head still in the water, take the knife and thrust it in behind their gill plates and cut through their gills on both sides. Because their heart is still pumping this will completely

drain them of blood/urea. It can take a while drain them, so this would be a good time to have a cup of coffee and relax.

The next step is the gutting of the fish to remove all the internal organs. This will also be done while the Shark is hanging over the side. I suggest you insert the knife at the rear and cutting the belly from the inside out down to the gills. Shark skin is very tough and abrasive and if you cut from the outside in you will have a hard time, for some reason from the inside to the outside works much better.

Dump the innards (overboard) like you would in any other fish and continue to flush the gut cavity with sea water. Between the blood and the offal, you will be just adding to your chum slick. I promise, you do not want any of that blood or innards working its way into your bilge. I knew a old time club member that got Shark blood into his bilge and he thought he was going to have to sell his boat.

OK, it is now time to bring your catch into your boat. Still be careful, their ability to thrash and bite can last longer than you think. This is where that under 5 Feet long comes into play. The fish need to be iced down at once, but according to the <u>LAW</u> they must be kept whole (in one piece from nose to tail). You cannot cut off the tail or any of the fins. <u>They require it be kept whole</u>. Luckily, their lack of bones can allow them to be bent to fit in a large cooler. If they do not fit, you can pack them in Ice in some plastic bags. Remember to pack their gut cavity with ice as well. Now it is time to head back to your dock.

Once at your home cleaning station you will need the following Items. Lots of Ice, a big bowl, a sharp filet Knife and a saw bladed (serrated) kitchen knife. This is also the time to get your hook back. You can cut the fish into filets or steaks; it will cook great either way. Though folks will often soak the Shark meat in Milk over night before cooking to remove any last urea taste, I have found it not necessary if the fish has been bled as I described. (Particularly Blacktip and Atlantic Sharp Nose Sharks, they are exceptionally good.)

When Fileting, remember to cut through the Shark skin from the inside out. They filet just like any other lager fish, except there are no small rib bones to deal with. Shark is easy to steak, since the serrated knife will cut through the cartilage easily. Keep everything as cold as you can through the cleaning process. By the way, after the steaks are grilled, the skin just peels off.

Like all fish, Shark cooks quite quickly. If grilling, you will need to coat with a little oil and seasoning to keep it from sticking and drying out. Truly, little seasoning is needed. It is a very mild fish, which cooks up white with a little more Texture "bite" than Grouper or Redfish. A lot of folks find they like texture of shark over the softer flakey kind of fish.

Thanks for reading and giving Shark a try. Remember if you sign up for the July Shark event, we will be cooking Shark for you and your guest. If you sign up and don't get a Shark, you will still be getting to taste some.

Remember, Grouper, Snook and Redfish, all strongly recommend you eat more Shark.

SUMMARY of PARKING RULES at SARAZEN

MSC picnics are generally held at Sarazen Park (check picnic flyer). Sarazen Park is a private park located at the SE corner of the Collier Blvd. and Swallow Ave. It is controlled by The Marco Island Civic Association (MICA) and parking in the park requires a member's pass. MICA membership is available to owners of improved property on Marco Island or yearly renters. Each adult member is issued a membership/beach pass card.

JOIN MICA to avoid any parking problems. If you live on the beach and don't belong, consider joining for the other benefits MICA provides. Besides use of Residents Beach and Sarazen Park, there are activities such as free concerts, plus discounts at restaurants and other venues.

Car pooling is suggested to provide more spots for fellow MICA members.

PARKING IN SURROUNDING SWALES IS SUBJECT TO A FINE

The normal fine for parking on a swale within the vicinity of Sarazen Park is \$95, however due to City Covid-19 restrictions the fine could be \$200 with the possibility your vehicle could be towed.

If you cannot get a MICA pass because you are a short term renter or have moved off the island there are alternatives:

- If you do not have a pass you can walk in and pay \$5/person (new rule). See below for suggestions on where to park.
- 2) Obtain a Collier County beach parking pass and park in the Collier County beach parking lot, which is adjacent and east of the MICA lot. The stickers are free to Collier County residents and available at the Marco Island Library and other sites throughout the County. You cannot park in the MICA lot with this sticker. Note that in season on good beach days, the Collier County lot could be full by mid-morning. MICA \$5 walk-in fee applies.
- Pay the fee for parking in the Collier County parking lot of \$8 (correct change required).
- Have a MICA member give you a ride into Sarazen. Suggested meeting places are: Publix, San Marco Catholic Church, the former big Publix, or the Jewish Congregation of Marco Island.
