President's Message for September 2021



September is here and the backwater fishing should be heating up. However, we still find ourselves waiting for the snook and redfish to arrive in larger numbers. Catching sure has been tough this summer.

The Red Grouper are being caught in closer with the warm water and out to 120'. The Snapper are out there on the wrecks and ledges, we have had a few nice Mangroves caught recently in the 20+ inch range. Permit continue to be found on the nearshore and offshore reefs and towers, good numbers of Permit continue to be reported. Some Cobia have been around, but expect the larger number and fish to begin to move through the area when the water temps begin to drop in the early fall...plan accordingly to complete your Offshore Slams. The best fishing will usually occur on the better tide days and windows – use your solunar activity tables. Focus on catching and upgrading your fish for the "MSC Offshore Slam, proudly sponsored by Rose Marina". Get out there and have some fun...and be safe.

- In addition to the Offshore Slam prizes, the largest fish of each individual species will be awarded a prize, as will the boat captain with the most entries caught.
- Any fish caught during this event will also qualify for MSC Leaderboard and Fish of the Month entry.

<u>Captains Meeting</u>: Due to the virus, there will be no captains meeting. Please see instructions on Sign-Up Sheet below to submit your Sign-up Sheet and to make payment.

Awards Party: There will be an awards party at Rose Marina in January 2022 (date / time TBA)

Rules:

- 1. All anglers must be an active MSC Member.
- 2. MSC "No Guide Rule" applies No fishing with, or on, a guide's boat.
- 3. MSC "Offshore Boundaries" apply South to Lat N 25.10.0, North to Lat N 26.05.5120', must fish within these boundaries and at a depth of 120' or less.
- 4. "Two Line Rule" applies No more than two rods per angler.
- 5. All fish entered must be caught by the angler entering the fish without assistance from any other angler.
- 6. Each fish entered must be photographed individually on a vertical edge tournament ruler, mouth closed and tight against the vertical edge of the ruler (not following the measurement rules may result in a reduction in size if the measurement is not clearly evident). All entry photos must be emailed to Jim Scarpa at the email address above within 24 hours of being caught, please include the name of the boat captain as well.
- 7. Sign-up Sheet and Entry Fee must be received by Jim Scarpa by June 30, 2021 or the angler cannot participate in the tournament. While tournament entry is allowed after fishing begins, no fish may be entered in the tournament that is caught prior to the angler submitting their Sign-up Sheet and Entry Fee.

TRIPLE CROWN TOURNAMENT UPDATE

Often thought to be the most elusive of the Triple Crown Tournament targeted species – tarpon – many of our anglers seem to have cracked the code. Nearly half of all tarpon caught thus far have been landed recently during the last few weeks of August. Ed Brown, Victor Ordija and Pete Arcidiacono have all registered some monsters. Having an abundance of patience and the right combination of strong braided line & leader (50lbs should do it) will get you started but finding the right spot is crucial. As an air breathing fish, tarpon will regularly come to the surface to roll & audibly gasp as they refill their gills. Once you've seen it a few times in calm water it's hard to miss. Pursuing these sightings will result in the highest probability of success. Once you're "hooked up" the fun begins; this is the patience & muscle part. Don't be surprised, tarpon are incredibly strong, make long runs and drag out lots of line. They also jump majestically out of the water and seem to dance a shimmy shake. When that happens be sure to follow the golden rule **BOW TO THE KING**. This means to lower your rod tip to create slack so that the fish doesn't break line or spit the hook. Easier said than done...



In addition to tarpon, redfish made a comeback this last month. Several redfish in the mid-20" range made their way to the standings list. One experienced angler was happy to get something on the board but was holding out hope that he could improve his position when the "bull" redfish return in October. Time will tell but one thing is certain – you won't catch fish unless you have a line in the water. With nearly two months remaining in the Triple Crown Tournament there's still action awaiting. Keep at it and take solace in the fact that it only takes a few big fish that are hungry and not so smart to put you in contention. Tight lines...

Update from the Editor September 2021

August was another challenging Fishing/Catching month. From the input I received offshore was "hit or miss", but the hits tended to be homeruns. Backwater saw an improvement from July, but most of the fish are hiding somewhere. Let us hope September brings better results.

The Water Advisory Committee (WAC) meeting held on the 19th was very interesting. Some of the issues I previously detailed, such as the "Door Hanger" program which will advise homeowners of the illegal discharge of their roof drainage into our channels, is still progressing. Also, the Environmental Research and Design, "Harper" report is due in the next few weeks. Please note there are two new members who are very involved, knowledgeable and good at detailing issues. For example, Michael Welty discussed safety and navigational issues in Marcos' waterways. He detailed the status of markers noting which governmental agency is responsible for the various locations, and wake violations. Eugene Wordehoff discussed water quality issues. He used a tremendous amount of data, charts and maps to highlight Dissolved Oxygen (DO) problems and Phosphate concentrations. His presentation was so professional that I assume he has a background in Environmental Engineering. My point is there is a lot of talent in WAC and the meetings are interesting. I believe the meetings can be accessed thru the Marco City website and of course attending a meeting is my recommendation. More to come on Water Quality in the coming months.

SUMMARY of PARKING RULES at SARAZEN

MSC picnics are generally held at Sarazen Park (check picnic flyer). Sarazen Park is a private park located at the SE corner of the Collier Blvd. and Swallow Ave. It is controlled by The Marco Island Civic Association (MICA) and parking in the park requires a member's pass. MICA membership is available to owners of improved property on Marco Island or yearly renters. Each adult member is issued a membership/beach pass card.

JOIN MICA to avoid any parking problems. If you live on the beach and don't belong, consider joining for the other benefits MICA provides. Besides use of Residents Beach and Sarazen Park, there are activities such as free concerts, plus discounts at restaurants and other venues.

Car pooling is suggested to provide more spots for fellow MICA members.

PARKING IN SURROUNDING SWALES IS SUBJECT TO A FINE

The normal fine for parking on a swale within the vicinity of Sarazen Park is \$95, however due to City Covid-19 restrictions the fine could be \$200 with the possibility your vehicle could be towed.

If you cannot get a MICA pass because you are a short term renter or have moved off the island there are alternatives:

- If you do not have a pass you can walk in and pay \$5/person (new rule). See below for suggestions on where to park.
- 2) Obtain a Collier County beach parking pass and park in the Collier County beach parking lot, which is adjacent and east of the MICA lot. The stickers are free to Collier County residents and available at the Marco Island Library and other sites throughout the County. You cannot park in the MICA lot with this sticker. Note that in season on good beach days, the Collier County lot could be full by mid-morning. MICA \$5 walk-in fee applies.
- Pay the fee for parking in the Collier County parking lot of \$8 (correct change required).
- Have a MICA member give you a ride into Sarazen. Suggested meeting places are: Publix, San Marco Catholic Church, the former big Publix, or the Jewish Congregation of Marco Island.
