## President's Message for October 2021

## Offshore Update – October 2021

#### What's Happening Offshore ...

For those of you who haven't heard, NOAA recently announced the closure of Red Grouper fishing in Federal waters (9 miles and further) for the balance of 2021, reopening Jan 1, 2022. Gray Triggerfish are also closed in Federal waters for the balance of the year and for the seasonal closure in January & February 2022, reopening March 1, 2022. Time to change strategies...

The Snapper are out there on the wrecks and ledges, Mangroves are in the middle of their summer spawn and should be happy to eat. Permit continue to be found on the nearshore and offshore reefs and towers, good numbers are being reported. Cobia are starting to show up in greater numbers recently and we expect them to continue to move through the area when the water temps begin to drop in the early fall...plan accordingly to complete your Offshore Slams. The best fishing will usually occur on the better tide days and windows – use your solunar activity tables. Focus on catching and upgrading your fish for the "MSC Offshore Slam, proudly sponsored by Rose Marina". Get out there and have some fun...and be safe.

### Prizes: Based on number of anglers participating, maximum one prize per angler

- Total combined length of the largest fish of each Offshore Slam species entered by the angler.
- Angler must catch and enter one fish of each species to qualify to win.
- All fish entered must be caught by the angler entering the fish without assistance.
- Angler may upgrade any fish entered if a larger specimen is caught within the tournament timeframe.
- This is an individual angler tournament and is not tied to a specific captain or boat. The angler may fish on anyone's boat at any time (like the Triple Crown).
- Offshore Slam species Grouper (Red, Gag or Black), Snapper (Mangrove, Yellowtail or Lane), Permit, Cobia.
- In addition to the Offshore Slam prizes, the largest fish of each individual species will be awarded a prize, as will the boat captain with the most entries caught.
- Any fish caught during this event will also qualify for MSC Leaderboard and Fish of the Month entry.

# <u>Captains Meeting</u>: Due to the virus, there will be no captains meeting. Please see instructions on Sign-Up Sheet below to submit your Sign-up Sheet and to make payment.

## Awards Party: There will be an awards party at Rose Marina in January 2022 (date / time TBA)

## Rules:

- 1. All anglers must be an active MSC Member.
- 2. MSC "No Guide Rule" applies No fishing with, or on, a guide's boat.
- 3. MSC "Offshore Boundaries" apply South to Lat N 25.10.0, North to Lat N 26.05.5120', must fish within these boundaries and at a depth of 120' or less.
- 4. "Two Line Rule" applies No more than two rods per angler.
- 5. All fish entered must be caught by the angler entering the fish without assistance from any other angler.
- 6. Each fish entered must be photographed individually on a vertical edge tournament ruler, mouth closed and tight against the vertical edge of the ruler (not following the measurement rules may result in a reduction in size if the measurement is not clearly evident). All entry photos must be emailed to Jim Scarpa at the email address above within 24 hours of being caught, please include the name of the boat captain as well.
- 7. Sign-up Sheet and Entry Fee must be received by Jim Scarpa by June 30, 2021 or the angler cannot participate in the tournament. While tournament entry is allowed after fishing begins, no fish may be entered in the tournament that is caught prior to the angler submitting their Sign-up Sheet and Entry Fee.

Breaking News: The Triple Crown Tournament has taken an abrupt swing these past few weeks. After a lull in the action during the dog days of August, September has brought renewed activity to the Marco Island area fisheries. Several new & upgraded entries have been posted recently and many anglers have made their way up the leaderboard standings – congratulations! Notably, Dana Sacks and her navigator husband Steve hooked into a big 37.50" snook near Keewaydin Island. Dana was elated and said that she never anticipated catching a fish over 36". As a result she's now purchased a **60**" fish ruler and can't wait to "test it out". Also, Dave Dodd made his way to the upper echelon of the standings with some incredible catches. Dave recently returned to the area after summering in Indiana and quickly hit the water. Dave typically fishes on any day that ends with a "Y". ## September MSC Kayak Group Trip

## The Bass Hole

The day started out great. Blue skies, no wind, water temperature 83 degrees. A great day to be at the Bass Hole. A few of the kayakers even reported catching a few small bass within the first few minutes on the water. Things were looking good. Unfortunately, it didn't get much better. A few more small bass, and that was it.

Several years ago, an average day at the Bass Hole would mean each angler would catch at least 25 bass, with plenty of big ones mixed in. Several anglers had days with catches of more than 50. What happened?

Unfortunately, not everyone who fishes the Bass Hole practices CPR (catch-photorelease) as we do when we fish there. Add to that the fact that there are no minimum or maximum length limits and quantity limits have not been enforced. We asked some questions and found out that some "anglers" have been coming to the Bass Hole with the sole intention of taking home as many bass as they can, and they do. This has resulted in total destruction of what used to be a great place to enjoy a fantastic day of fishing. Based on what has happened here, I doubt whether there will be any future kayak trips made to the Bass Hole.

Actually watching a great fishing resource completely die off in a matter of less than 2 years is cause for concern. Size limits and enforcement of bag limits would have helped preserve this resource, but it looks like it is too late for the Bass Hole now. If you think about what is happening with salt-water fishing, there are some similarities. For the past few years, there have been reports of reductions in the number of fish being caught in both offshore and backwater locations. While some of the reductions may be from "over-fishing" a large part of it is more likely due to loss of sea grass and declining water quality. There are things that we can and must do to ensure that our water quality improves. The future of recreational fishing depends on it. Let the demise of the Bass Hole be an example for all of us. Get involved in efforts to clean up our water and help make a difference while we still can!

  - Check-in opens at 7:15 AM, closes at 8:00 AM.
  - Boats not checked in by 8 AM are disqualified. Official start at 8:00 AM.
  - At the start, 3 boats will leave at one time (by starting number determined by date of entry). There will be a 30 second interval between each group of 3 boats
- Trailering of boats to a different location after the start is not allowed
- MSC North boundaries apply, <u>SOUTH to WEST PASS. BE ADVISED! There is No</u> <u>Tournament Fishing in EVERGLADES NATIONAL PARK, (catch and release only).</u>
- · 2 people per boat. No extra passengers or observers allowed onboard.
- Weigh in is at Coon Key Marina, Scales for weigh-in open at <u>1:00 PM sharp and will</u> close at <u>3:00 PM</u>. Penalties apply (4 oz. per 5 min) after 3:00 PM. <u>Boats not back at the</u> marina by <u>3:30 will be disqualified</u>
- When returning for weigh-in, please call in on VHF channel 68 when in the vicinity of channel marker "Red 6" (in the channel near the Marina). Use your entry number for ID.
- To account for all boats, please check-in, even if you have no fish to report.
- · At the dock, you will be given a basket to place your redfish into for weighing
- Only slot-sized redfish (18" 27") will be weighed. Submission of smaller or larger fish
  will result in disqualification. Weigh-in is open. Captains of each boat will be asked to
  verify the weight of their entry on the scale.

# Update from the Editor October 2021

There was a very interesting Water Advisory Committee (WAC) meeting on the 16<sup>th</sup>. The City Manager was attending and made numerous comments, in particular regarding the long awaited Harper Report. The report details Water Quality (WQ) issues, concerns, and recommendations for improving the WQ going forward. The Manager noted that the City Council will review the report at its' meeting Monday the 20<sup>th</sup>. He also noted that the City would take a "layered" approach to addressing WQ issues. The WAC will start its' formal review of the report at the meeting of October 21<sup>st</sup>. Other issues recently discussed by WAC such as residential stormwater discharges into our channels, Public Education regarding WQ, and use of non-potable water from our Sewage plant for irrigation on Collier Blvd., Golf courses and condo lawns, will all be impacted by the report. Any WAC recommendations regarding these issues will follow the review of the Harper Report. As one can see from my brief summary, the WAC meetings are getting more focused. I encourage everyone to attend the meetings in person or on line, checkout the City website for details.

### SUMMARY of PARKING RULES at SARAZEN

MSC picnics are generally held at Sarazen Park (check picnic flyer). Sarazen Park is a private park located at the SE corner of the Collier Blvd. and Swallow Ave. It is controlled by The Marco Island Civic Association (MICA) and parking in the park requires a member's pass. MICA membership is available to owners of improved property on Marco Island or yearly renters. Each adult member is issued a membership/beach pass card.

JOIN MICA to avoid any parking problems. If you live on the beach and don't belong, consider joining for the other benefits MICA provides. Besides use of Residents Beach and Sarazen Park, there are activities such as free concerts, plus discounts at restaurants and other venues.

Car pooling is suggested to provide more spots for fellow MICA members.

#### PARKING IN SURROUNDING SWALES IS SUBJECT TO A FINE

The normal fine for parking on a swale within the vicinity of Sarazen Park is \$95, however due to City Covid-19 restrictions the fine could be \$200 with the possibility your vehicle could be towed.

If you cannot get a MICA pass because you are a short term renter or have moved off the island there are alternatives:

- If you do not have a pass you can walk in and pay \$5/person (new rule). See below for suggestions on where to park.
- 2) Obtain a Collier County beach parking pass and park in the Collier County beach parking lot, which is adjacent and east of the MICA lot. The stickers are free to Collier County residents and available at the Marco Island Library and other sites throughout the County. You cannot park in the MICA lot with this sticker. Note that in season on good beach days, the Collier County lot could be full by mid-morning. MICA \$5 walk-in fee applies.
- Pay the fee for parking in the Collier County parking lot of \$8 (correct change required).
- Have a MICA member give you a ride into Sarazen. Suggested meeting places are: Publix, San Marco Catholic Church, the former big Publix, or the Jewish Congregation of Marco Island.
