

REDFISH XV / COVID REVENGE

Spotted Seatrout
Snook
Redfish (Count as two)

Seatrout



• Like grass flats 3' - 10' range Prefer cooler water Goes into sand holes near flats in cool snap Eat bait fish and shrimp Travel in schools, by class Does not hug shoreline

Seatrout - What to use

 Light to medium rod, spinning reel • 20 LB Braid test line 20 LB fluorocarbon leader 2' long • 1/8 - 3/8 oz. jig heads Jig head with Gulp Popping cork and #2 or #3 hooks

Seatrout – What to use

Body colors – white, pink, lt. green, yellow Body shapes – fish, twister tail, shrimp Feathered jigs Jigs tipped with small piece of shrimp Early AM top water popping lure (1/4 oz.) Yo-yo Rattle Trap

Seatrout

 Medium to slow retrieve Darting / twitching motion Modest hook set, <u>mouths are soft</u> Watch for follows or surface feeding Drift an area till hook up • Try various depths • If you get one, you should get more

Snook



 Hunt by ambush • Under docks, logs, mangroves, in shade Like warmer water - 70° Eat bait fish, crabs and shrimp Backwater, near shore reefs and beaches • Structure oriented, pilings, inlets and bars Tends to be near main current

Snook – What to use

- Medium, medium/heavy action rod, spinning reel
- 30lb. Braid test line
- 30 lb. test fluorocarbon leader, 2' 3' long
 Direct tie leader to line
 Popping corks live shrimp & live fingerlings
 Top Water Stick Baits

Snook – What to use

• Jig head 1/4 - 3/4 oz. Body – shrimp, twister tail, fish shaped Color – white, brown, yellow, red, pink Feathered jigs – assorted colors • All tipped with a small piece of shrimp Scented plastic baits

Snook – What to use

 Crank baits 1/4 - 1/2 oz. Top water lures – early AM Rattle Traps Popping cork under cover - Mangroves • Warmer water – faster retrieve Always check leader after hook-up

Snook

 Aggressive strike, will chase lures, jumps High speed runs – sprinter • Runs Beaches nearer shore than you think Razor sharp gill plates – cut leader and you Uses structure to ambush Likes shade – cover - Docks Once hooked will often run for cover

Redfish



 Likes warmer water - 70° Eats crabs, shrimp and bait fish Tails in shallow water Frequents oyster bars, mangrove roots, shell mounds and channels Outgoing tides Down current of bars and structure

Redfish – What to use

Medium rod, spinning reel
30lb. Braid test line
30 lb. fluorocarbon leader, 2' – 3' long
Direct tie leader to line
Well maintained drag system

Redfish – What to use

Gold spoon (weedless)
¼ - ½ oz. jig heads
Colors – white, yellow, red, brown, and pink
Shapes – shrimp, twister tails, bait fish & crab
Tipped with small piece of shrimp

Redfish – What to use

Popping cork and live bait (shrimp – fish)
under mangroves and edge of oyster bars
Rattle traps
Top water lures, both popping and propellers

Redfish – Where

 Tailing on the flats - Bottom Feeder Oyster bars & shell bars Mangrove roots with shade & oysters Near shore reefs and inlets Use current to bring out food

Redfish

• Firm hook set

• Strong run (distance runner)

Solid strike

• Do not jump

• They will fight till the end
